COVID-19: Usage Guidance and Rules effective April 20, 2020

Commercial Marina: The marina has been and will remain open to customers. Only boat owners and crew are allowed on the floats. Please practice physical distancing and wear face protection cover when on the floats.

Recreational Marina: The marina opened April 16. All paperwork and payments must be completed before bringing a vessel to a marina slip. Only boat owners and crew will be allowed on the floats. Please practice physical distancing and wear face protection cover when on the floats.


Transient Float: The float is open for drop-off and pick-up per the posted regulations. Only boat owners and crew are allowed on the float. Please practice physical distancing and wear face protection cover when on the float.

Glover Wharf Apron and Public Pier: Fishing is not permitted at this time until signage and physical distancing measures are put in place that are consistent with local and state guidelines. If walking, or sitting on a bench, please practice physical distancing and wear face protection cover.


Kayak/SUP Racks: The racks at Lynch Park, Dane Street Beach, Obear Park, Pleasant View Beach, and Sandy Point opened April 16. All customers must have paid the fee and have a current sticker on their vessels before bringing their kayaks to the assigned rack location. Please practice physical distancing, have only one person at a rack at a time retrieving or returning a vessel, and wear face protection cover when at or near the racks.
