RE: Improvements in Beverly's Waterfront Activities and Promotion

The Beverly Harbor Management Authority (BHMA) recently improved recreational opportunities and public access to the City's waterfront with additional kayak/SUP racks at Lynch Park, Independence Park, and Dane Street Beach. Each rack can hold 8 kayaks/SUPs. These new racks will join the existing kayak/SUP racks at Lynch, Dane, Pleasant View Beach, Obear Park, and Sandy Point. Racks are available on a first come, first served basis for \$100/season to those who obtain a sticker from the Beverly Harbor Management Authority by calling 978-921-6011 or visiting www.gloverwharf.com for an Interest Application.

The BHMA has also installed new public access signs to direct residents to several harbor access points between Dane Street and Gillis Park. The new signs are a bright blue—evoking the clean water of the harbor—with diagrams denoting which activities can be enjoyed at each site (viewing, fishing, kayaking, and swimming).
