

## **Beverly Harbor Management Authority**

### **Background**

The Beverly Harbor Management Authority (BHMA), created by the State Legislature in 1987, supports the City of Beverly on various projects and initiatives that involve waterfront development and use. BHMA also focuses on making waterfront access and enjoyment more accessible to all stakeholders in the city - residents, commercial fishermen, recreational boaters, recreational fishermen, and visitors.



### **Key Objectives**

- Oversee operation of public facilities on the harbor.
- Propose municipal landside and waterside harbor improvement projects, and pursue funding for those projects.
- Foster public access to and along the shoreline, and at public facilities.
- Advocate and support implementation of water-related resources.
- Work with others to maintain and improve city-owned property on the waterfront to include recreational and commercial marinas, and the city pier.
- Review and comment on waterfront developments requiring licenses or permits from state agencies; recommend mitigation to benefit the public when appropriate.
- Respond to community needs at the waterfront during unforeseen circumstances.

### Marina Operations and Management Support

- Provide oversight and prepare budget for the operation of the two city marinas.
- Set annual fees for commercial and recreational vessels slips, kayaks, and dinghies.
- Promote availability through Glover Wharf website, signage, and word of mouth.

### Public Access Promotion and Waterfront Enjoyment

- **Public Ways, Viewing Venues** - identify and maintain signage at over 30 City locations.
- **Harbor Fest** - host annual waterfront “party” the first Saturday after Labor Day - first held in 2011 - to promote the waterfront at Glover Wharf.
- **Northshore Striper Blitz** – facilitate fishing tournament for charity, Father’s Day weekend.
